
About CIPCO

CIPCO and the State of Iowa:

Most students with intern experience in lowa remain in lowa after graduation Companies will be required to provide a substantial learning experience for the intern. The work is to be semi-professional to professional in nature, preferably in the student's area of expertise.

Examples of substantial work experiences might include: development of a business plan, marketing plan, website, etc.; organization of a large event; research and development assistance of a new product; assistance with the company's accounting, recordkeeping, etc.; assistance with a technical operation for the company; assistance in industrial technology, engineering, chemistry, biology, physics, mathematics, etc.; and any other substantial learning experience.

Internships should not include excessive supporting tasks such as photocopying, filing, lawn mowing, cleaning, food service, errandrunning, etc.
